Peter Dehne is professor for planning law and building law at the University of Applied Sciences Neubrandenburg. After his university studies of town and regional planning and the traineeship for urban development he was staff member in a town planning office in Berlin. During this time he was responsible for the accompanying research, evaluation and experience exchange of 20 best-practice models and pilot-projects for village and small town development as well as for the execution of simulation games to test new regulations, instruments and strategies for sustainable local land management by order of federal and federal state authorities. Since 1990 he has advised small towns municipalities and Regions in East Germany. His key aspects of applied sciences at the University are the consequences of the demographic change on the regional development, the adoption and rebuilding of services of general interests, co-operative regional planning, strategies and policy for rural areas as well as strategic planning for small and medium-sized towns. Several research projects are aligned to strengthen the surrounding area and anchor the University inside the region like the Masterplan for Public Services, Integrative Coastal Zone Management, the cross border Regional Agenda 21 Szczecin Bay or the building of the local and regional education management. His seminars, courses, student projects and excursions are also connected with the research projects and regional challenges.
