

Research Title



Empowerment of Syrian refugee families with a special focus on the role of the family head in Jordan

Research Rationale



- It has become apparent that civil society organizations are playing an active role in refugee support.
- The support manifests in different ways including but not limited to raising awareness of the refugee family about the repercussions and negative downfalls of seeking asylum, especially in the case of Syrian refugee families.
- These negatives are a result of the refugee family's exposure to the accompanying factors of the asylumseeking process, which sometimes appears to threaten its entity.



Research Question

The research seeks to answer the following question: What are the main roles displayed by civil society organizations which contribute to the social and economic empowerment of Syrian refugee head of family?

Sub-Questions

1- To what extent the role of civil society institutions can empower the Syrian refugee families' social lives?

2-What are the roles of civil society institutions in empowering economically the Syrian refugee families?

3- What is the role of social worker in empowering Syrian refugee families through civil society institutions?

4- What are the forms of support from civil society organizations for Syrian refugee families?



Methodology

Sampling and Criteria

The research will rely on **Convenience** sampling of institutions and organizations.

Key civil society organizations providing services to head of Syrian refugee family regardless of refugee status.

Organizations that are currently active in responding to social and economic empowerment of Syrian refugee families.

Research Tool

Semi-structured interviews will be used to allow space for providing new information. The interviews are going to be conducted in person.

Prior to that, quantitative research will be conducted through the distribution of surveys among key CBOs.
